

PICKS FOR FEEDING DAD

Mother's Day conjures images of flowery brunches, mini quiches and crustless sandwiches. On Father's Day, I think meat and grease.

The Cowboy Baby from BurgerQue in Fort Myers has "I love you Dad" written all over it. An Angus chuck patty topped with juicy brisket, barbecue sauce, spicy pickles and creamy slaw – what's not to love? That, an order of gravy fries and an extra dose of Lipitor, and dad's good to go.

If dad bleeds red sauce and mozzarella, there is Rosedale Brick Oven in Naples. Their thin pies are flash-baked to crunchy, chewy, Neapolitan-style perfection in the restaurant's oak-fired oven. They come to the table steaming and bubbly. All dad needs is restraint.

For the carnivore dad who's tired of the usual steakhouse, there is **El Gaucho Inca**. The Argentinean side of this also-Peruvian restaurant turns out sizzling beef ribs, T-bones, beef sweetbreads and black sausage. The Fort Myers restaurant's larger setting means you can bring the whole family.

If dad's craving a little something simpler, there's **Pete's Fish & Chips** in Cape Coral. Run by an Englishman and his wife, Pete's serves thick fillets of beer-battered cod fried to an ethereal, greaseless crunch. The chips, fat potato wedges, hold true to the authentic British style. And dad can grab a crisp cider or dark ale to wash it all down.
